

With over 65,000 residents, Rockville is home to a host of dining, retail, and entertainment options. Residents enjoy the beautiful and abundant parks and wide array of restaurants and retail, all just a few Metro stops to the heart of Downtown D.C. and many of the area's top attractions. Consistently ranked a top place to live, Rockville is uniquely situated to feel like a larger city while still offering residential comforts.

The City of Rockville is also the county seat of Montgomery County, MD, making it a hub for local government as well as a booming business district. Many people are drawn to the area for employment with hundreds of companies and organizations in the scientific and technology fields.

Getting Around

Rockville is a large, but walkable city that offers residents plenty of ways to get around or commute.

One of the easiest ways to get to Rockville is by Metro. The Metro Red Line has <u>several stops</u> at White Flint, Twinbrook, Rockville Town Center, and Shady Grove.

The Rockville Metro station also connects commuters to the MARC train, which runs between West Virginia, Northern Maryland, and Washington, D.C., and Amtrak, which runs through several states like Pennsylvania and Illinois for further travel.

In addition to driving, residents in Rockville can also access alternate modes of transportation, such as Metrobuses and Capital Bikeshare, makingRockvilleacommuter-friendly town.



Fresh, friendly, and fast are the pillars of <u>First</u> <u>Watch</u>'s philosophy. They serve a variety of breakfast and lunch options from omelets and French toast to healthy flexitarian options.

Check out <u>Urban Hot Pot</u> for an all-you-can-eat personal hot pot experience. It gets rave reviews for its variety of options, add-ins brought to you on a conveyor belt, and overall food quality.

<u>Clyde's Tower Oaks Lodge</u> is unique for its lodge style decor, which creates a cozy ambiance. Its seasonal menu includes ever-changing, classic American dishes.

Nosh Grill House & Karaoke is not your typical Chinese restaurant. This dinner and karaoke spot is the perfect place for a fun night out! The menu is inspired by Northern Chinese cuisine along with influences from Japan, Korea, and Russia.



If You Love Happy Hour Deals


Rockville is a hot spot for happy hour any day of the week.

Rockville is the perfect city to stop by a happy hour after work. Here are some you shouldn't miss.

At <u>Botanero Restaurant</u>, you can enjoy happy hour Mondays through Fridays from 4-6 pm. Sangria, cocktail infusions, wines, beers, and select small plates and flatbreads are the perfect incentive to stop by after work.

Cooper's Hawk Winery & Restaurant is a wine-centric restaurant, inspired by Napa Valley's wine country, featuring a tasting room, full restaurant, bar, and even an artisanal market. Happy hour runs every Monday to Friday from 3-5:30pm, offering wine specialty drinks, wine by the glass, select cocktails and appetizers.

<u>World of Beer</u> is great for those looking for a casual atmosphere. It offers a large selection of beer (as the name implies) and food to snack on. Happy hour is Monday-Friday from 3-7pm.









If You Love Shopping

Rockville is filled with areas that offer a wide variety of shopping and dining options for residents.

<u>Pike & Rose</u> is a modern mall and premier destination for shopping, dining, and entertainment. A few popular stores here include Bluemercury, Sephora, L.L. Bean, Sur La Table, REI, Uniqlo, West Elm and more.


<u>Rockville Town Square</u> is at the center of the City of Rockville. There, you can explore a variety of dining options, including El Mercat, Gyuzo, First Watch, Kussi and Lebanese Taverna. You'll also find gyms, spas, Trader Joe's, the Rockville Memorial Library, and <u>more</u>.

Rio Lakefront, a waterfront shopping and entertainment center, is another popular spot for Rockville residents. You'll find over 40 different shopping and dining options like Nando's Peri-Peri, Copper Canyon Grill, Uncle Julio's, Target, South Moon Under, and Dick's Sporting Goods.

King Farm Village Center features a Safeway, pure barre, salons and a variety of restaurants such as Fontina Grille and Botanero. Or you can take a stroll through Downtown Crown and explore various spas and different restaurants, including Ruth's Chris Steakhouse, &pizza, and Ted's Bulletin.

If You Love Being Active

Rockville residents have plenty of opportunities to stay active—here are some of the best places to get outdoors.







<u>Lake Needwood</u>, part of <u>Rock Creek Park</u>, is a great place to stop by when the weather's nice for boating or water activities. You can rent kayaks, rowboats, canoes, or pedal boats, spend the afternoon fishing, or take a hike on the trails around the scenic 75-acre lake.

If you want some kid-friendly entertainment and love adventure, the nearby <u>Go</u> <u>Ape Treetop Adventure Course</u> offers ziplines, high-ropes obstacle courses, and swings for all ages.

If you're looking for something more relaxing, head to one of the several public golf courses near Rockville. <u>Needwood Golf Course</u> and <u>Falls Road Golf Course</u> are all frequented by residents for their natural rolling landscapes and entertaining courses.

While the City of Rockville is booming with businesses and urban offerings, residents are still surrounded by many green spaces, including 65 different parks. Rockville Civic Center Park, Mattie JT Stepanek Park, Crabbs Branch Park, and the larger Rock Creek Park are some areas where residents can bike, take a stroll, or just spend time outdoors. Explore your adventurous side at one of these local attractions, perfect for all ages.

Pike & Rose offers something fun for everyone. Gather with friends at Pinstripes for bowling and bocce, or head to IPIC Theaters for an upscale way to enjoy the latest films with plush seating and in-theater service.

There's more at Rockville Town Square than just dining and shopping. Skate at the ice rink in the winter, play around the Splash Pad while staying cool in the summer, or catch a movie at the Regal Rockville Theater. If you love art, the VisArts Center offers classes as well as rotating gallery exhibitions.





<u>Rio Lakefront</u> is a great place to take the family on the weekend. It houses family-friendly attractions like the Carousel, AMC DINE-IN Rio Cinema, Dave & Buster's, Muse Paintbar, and more. Stop by the <u>Washingtonian Paddle Boats</u> to take a boat ride around the lake or feed the fish.

Across from Rio Lakeside, <u>iFly Indoor Skydiving</u> brings the thrill of skydiving to nearby Gaithersburg. Held up mid-air by fans, skydivers get to experience the freefall sensation of skydiving out of a plane in iFly's indoor wind tunnel.

If your young ones are curious about nature, check out the <u>Meadowside Nature</u> <u>Center</u> where kids can learn about natural and cultural history through trails, programs, and exhibits like the Curiosity Corner and Raptor Deck.

If You Love Local Events

Being the lively urban area that it is, Rockville has a ton of seasonal local events and attractions to check out.








Art fans will love the <u>Rockville Arts Festival</u>, a two-day long festival held annually in early May. You'll find over 100 fine arts vendors in the festival's outdoor gallery in Rockville Town Square. Residents can shop for art, see art is ts at work, and enjoy local entertainment.

Celebrate Memorial Day weekend at the <u>Hometown Holidays Music Festival</u> in Rockville Town Square. The festival features over 30 free live performances, activities for kids, the Taste of Rockville, and ends with the annual <u>Memorial Day Ceremony and Parade</u>.

<u>Rocktobierfest</u> brings Oktoberfest celebrations to Rockville Town Square featuring three stages of entertainment. Thousands of residents attend the annual festival for music, food, and activities. Of course, keeping with the spirit of Otoberfest, local breweries supply plenty of beer for the festival.

Year-round, Rockville has several farmers' markets to provide fresh produce, plants, and other goods to residents. Two notable markets are the <u>Rockville Farmers' Market</u>, which operates on Saturdays (9am-1pm) from May-November and the <u>Shady Grove Farmers' Market</u>, which is open on Wednesdays from May-October (11am-2pm).

The residents of the Rockville community can always find reasons to come together at the many exciting local events and attractions each year.
